What is axial Spondyloarthritis?



What is axial Spondyloarthritis (axSpA) and who does it affect?

axSpA is a painful, progressive and chronic inflammatory rheumatic disease primarily affecting the **Spine** and sacroiliac joints - the joint between the pelvis and the base of the spine.1





The disease is believed to affect up to 1 in 150 of the global population²



This suggests there could be up to **56 million** people living with axSpA across the globe.3



Symptoms of axSpA typically first emerge between the age of 20 and 40⁴

axSpA is now recognised to be **equally** common in men and women

(although the disease may present differently between the sexes).5



Signs and symptoms of axSpA

Gradual onset of pain and stiffness in the lower back, buttocks and **hips** are typically the first symptoms of axSpA.6



Other common indications of axSpA are:4,6



Stiffness, especially after extended periods of rest



Pain and stiffness that often get better with movement and worse with rest



Fatigue



Typical symptom onset **before** the age of 40
